It was great to have the guests and members at our 1st anniversary. Thanks to every one for making it so enjoyable.

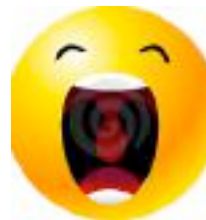
The Country Club is a really great venue for our meetings!!

AUGUST SPEAKER ELISABETH BOHUN



Everyone had an enjoyable day at Denmark River Probus on Wednesday, our first birthday, with an interesting speaker and a tasty lunch of fruit, sandwiches and cheese and of course a birthday cake. A special thanks must go to the committee for their effort in providing the lunch which everyone enjoyed.

Elisabeth Bohun Financial Information Service Officer (FISO) from the Department of Human Services in Albany was our guest speaker. Elisabeth is one of only two Financial Officers in the country so we are very lucky to have her.

Elisabeth's role is to provide financial information to people, not advice. Elisabeth loves what she does, she gives talks to groups such as ours and runs seminars as well as providing information to individuals. In her talk Elisabeth provided us with figures and facts but I will give a general account of her talk as I don't want to give false information.

Elisabeth deals with people in the workforce right through to retirement. She helps people access super money and pensions and can give advice on estate succession planning and accessing residential care.

She talked about changes to the budget that will effect seniors and the new deeming rules. There will be changes to the assets test for the Commonwealth Seniors Health Card. The aged pension is still 65 but the change to 70 is still pending. For those born after 1957 it is 57 years.

She knows all about the work test and how long people can remain overseas before their pension rate is adjusted, she has information on accessing disability pensions and rent assistance when traveling.

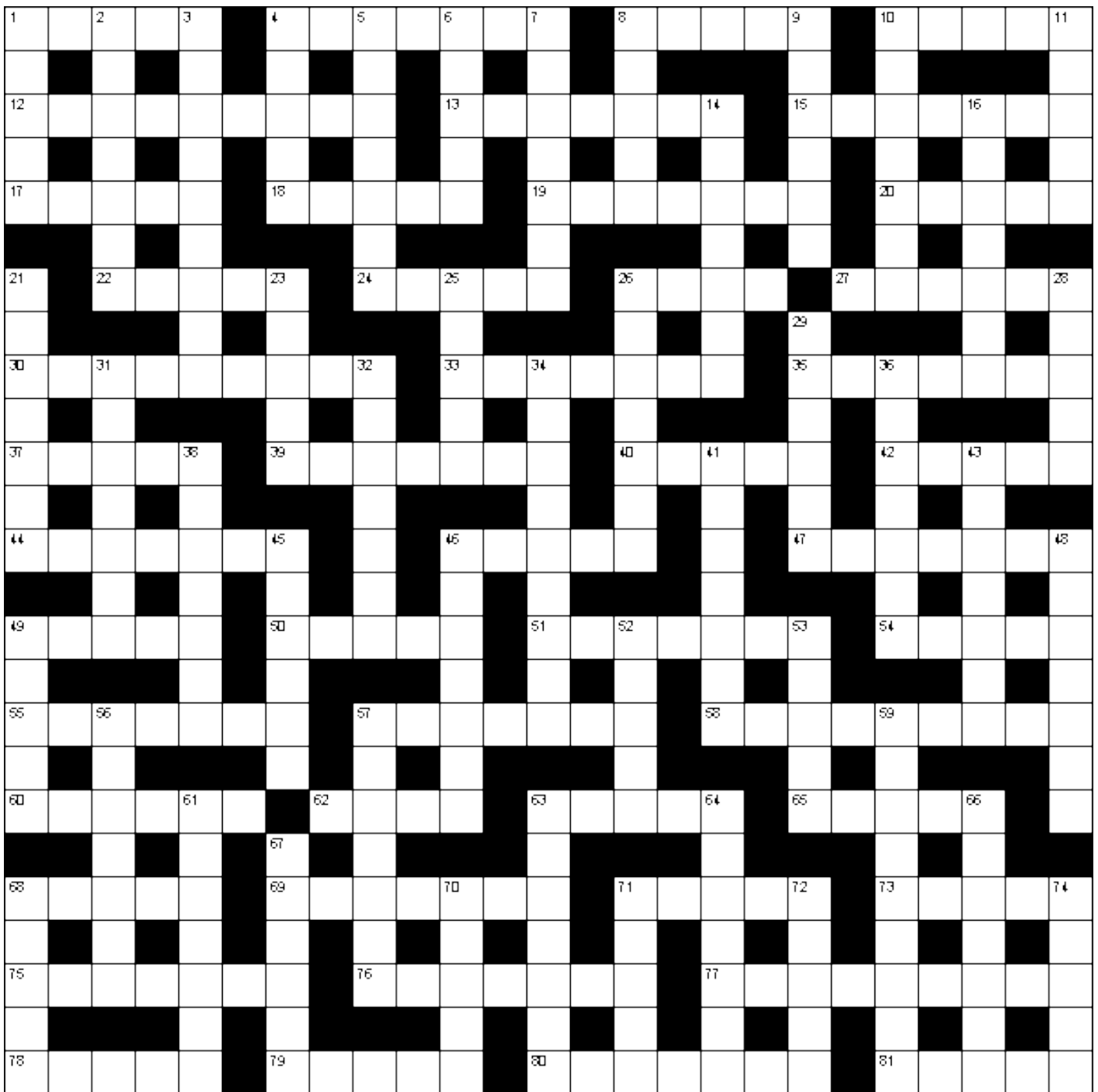
Other outings have been to Discovery Bay, the National Anzac Centre and a cruise on the Kalgan River Queen, to name a few.
