Please phone Jan on **9848 2455** to secure a place at one of these wonderful events.

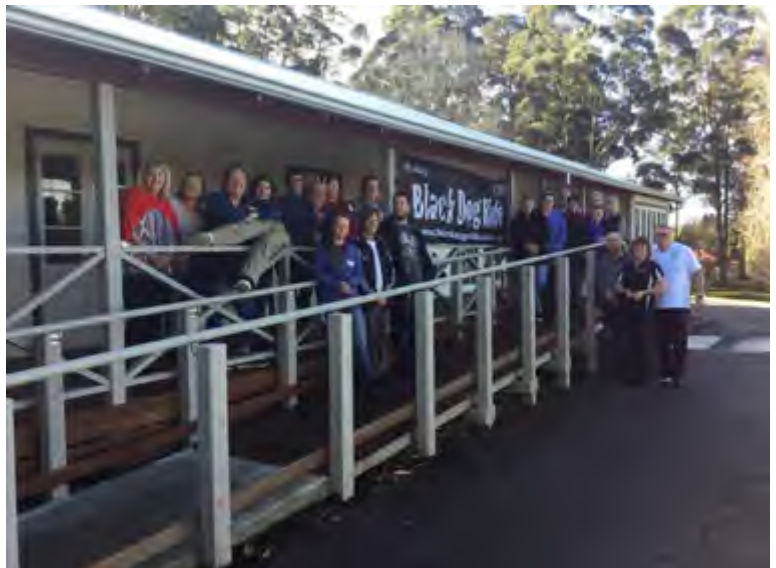

Chris Vogel:

The Philosophical Cheesemaker was our guest speaker at our last meeting:

Chris grew up in Denmark on the property which his Father, a Swiss immigrant, purchased in the 60's. In 1993 Chris purchased the dairy farm from his Dad and renamed the property Dellendale Farm.

In 1996 Chris worked in a Cheese Factory in Switzerland as a labourer, he went on to gain an apprenticeship followed by a Bachelor Degree in Dairy Science. Working in 7 factories over a 10year period gaining a broad experience in cheese making techniques.

In 2010 he returned to Dellendale Farm and started producing small batches of cheeses. Dellendale milk is sourced from their neighbours robotic dairy where the cows get to decide the times they are milked!, some cows visit up to 3 or 4 times in a 24hour period. The main milking herd run and feed on Dellendale Farm close to the factory. Chris mentioned that the King Island creamery keeps 2 separate factories, one for Blue Cheese, the other for all other cheeses to make sure there is no cross contamination from the spores, he ruined his own production of soft cheese one year by not taking enough care.

Cheese contains many types of fat and the balance can be down to the type of pastures and weather conditions in a year.

The samples of cheeses that Chris bought along went down beautifully as dessert after our lovely French orientated lunch.

Plan to arrive 12.30 for lunch.

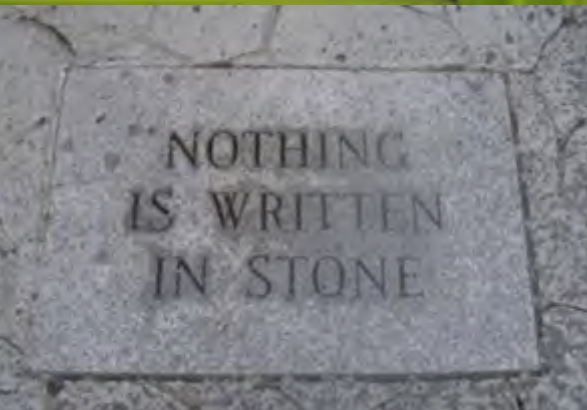
